Respect Other Human Beings

- Keep your workplace free from any forms of Harassment, Discrimination and Abuse.
- Enforce basic human rights such as No Child Labor, No Forced Labor, Fair Wages, Freedom of Association, etc.

Safe & Healthy Working Conditions

- Keep your workplace safe and hygienic. Necessary precautions shall be taken.

- Minimize the usage of resources – electricity, paper, water, etc.
- Sort the waste and recycle as much as possible.

For Software producers

- Minimize the energy consumption of your products by implementing energy efficient coding.

For Hardware producers

- **Know the Materials well (kind, type, chemical substances, process used, etc.)**
 - Get material declarations from suppliers to prepare for authority & customer questions.
 - Review the banned chemical substances for your type of product and related products.
(Legal compliance, e.g. RoHS)
 - Perform allergy tests if the product touches the skin.
 - **Imagine how your product is dealt with at its End of Life**
 - Consider Easy-to-Disassemble design to increase the recyclability.
 - Consider Easy-to-Repair design that could reduce the cost and increase the product lifetime.
 - Consider when the product is burned or land-filled. Any hazard to the air or the earth?
 - **Minimize the factors of Climate Change**
 - Optimize packaging and shipping.
 - Minimize the energy consumption of your product and the manufacturing process.
 - **Imagine Who is making your product and Where it is made**
 - Concern if the basic human rights for the factory workers are ensured.
 - Provide a basic "Code of Conduct*" to suppliers together with other manufacturing contracts and request them to sign it.
- * Code of Conduct: No child labor, No forced labor, Fair wages, Safe working conditions, No pollution and proper waste & chemical handling at the factory, etc.
